## Remote Learning Survey

Thanks to all the parents and carers who completed our remote learning survey. We were delighted with the response, having received feedback from parents of 58 children. The overwhelming majority of comments were incredibly positive, grateful and supportive of our efforts to provide children with high quality remote learning during this national lockdown period. We are also grateful for the suggestions made and will take those into consideration as we continue to reflect and develop in these fast-moving times.

## Half Term w/c 15 February 2021 – school closed to all

School will finish at the usual time of 3:30pm for children in school on Friday 12 February and will reopen on Monday 22 February for children of critical workers only. We are hoping that 22 February will bring further information about the planned reopening of school from 8 March. There will be no remote learning set during half term; it will resume on Monday 22 February. I’m guessing it will be a very welcome half term break for everyone!

### Contact tracing during half term

As in the first week of the Christmas holidays, parents of children who have been in school will be required to report a positive Covid-19 test result during the half term holiday. This can be done by emailing our dedicated email address [covidalert@crayke.n-yorks.sch.uk](mailto:covidalert@crayke.n-yorks.sch.uk) This will be monitored between 9am and 10am each day during the holiday. Please note that the school telephone line will NOT be available during the school holidays so email is the only method of contact to be used. In the event of us being notified of a positive case, we will contact relevant parents and carers via email to inform you of the implications.

### Free School Meals – vouchers for half term


### Lateral Flow Testing

Staff are now adept at lateral flow testing; the aim of which is to identify asymptomatic individuals. This does have a potential impact on staffing, which in turn may have an impact on possible school closure. Staff are testing on an evening, at home, as per government guidelines. Relevant families will be notified by email where necessary.

### Covid symptoms

A reminder for anyone who has children still attending school that if anyone in your household develops Covid symptoms, you must all self-isolate and the children are unable to attend school. The person with symptoms needs to seek a test as soon as possible. The child/ren may only return to school once a negative test result has been received, as long as they have not developed symptoms. It is encouraging that test results do seem to be coming back much quicker.

### World Book Day – 4 March 2021

We recognise that World Book Day will be slightly different this year as we anticipate that the children will still be engaged in remote learning. Normally we would be issuing paper book tokens at about this time. **Children of Light Festival – Message from Lucy Willshaw Children and Families Worker**

Next month, the Diocese of York is launching a year long event called the 'Children of Light Festival'. It is a time to celebrate and encourage young people in their faith and an opportunity for members of the church to consider how young people fit into the life of the church. There are going to be resources and events for schools and churches to engage with over the year, so expect to hear more about it in the coming months!

Due to current restrictions, the opening service, with the Archbishop of York, is going to be a videoed service which will be available for churches to share and use within their parishes. Those organising the service would very much like to include some prayers written by children and are inviting young people across the diocese to contribute to this. It will not be possible to use all prayers submitted in the service, but all prayers will be published on the 'Children of Light' pages on the diocesan website.

Would your child like to write a prayer for the service and the festival? Prayers do not have to be long and wordy, but just reflect your child's true thoughts, feelings, thanks, praise and questions for God. It might be about hopes and fears for the coming year, what it means to be a light in darkness, what being a beacon of light for Jesus might mean.

Prayers should be emailed to me by the end of half term (midday on Friday, 19th February) – they can be typed up on Word or photographed. It would be great if you could include your child's first name, age and location. Thank you.
