The bookings will be automatically created when you follow the links and prompts once you have signed in. Please note the information you enter must match that on our records so for example using the full name Alexander rather than shortened version Alex. You only need to enter one child's details, but it will automatically link to their siblings so you can book all appointments in one place. We would strongly encourage parents who don't live together to attend the same appointment if at all possible. This will ensure that the same information is being shared with both parties at the same time. This can be done by one parent booking the appointment and then following the prompts to invite the other parent to join the appointment. Only in exceptional circumstances, where this is absolutely not a possibility, please book separate appointments.

School will close for Easter on **Friday 26 March** for all children. We will reopen to all children on **Tuesday 13 April**.

NYCC information: Support for families over the Easter holidays

North Yorkshire County Council will be delivering a programme of support over Easter through a combination of the extension of the Covid Winter Grant scheme food vouchers for all families who have previously been in receipt of them and age-appropriate Activity Packs for those statutory school-age children who are eligible for free school meals*. The packs have been put together by North Yorkshire Together (consortia of North Yorkshire Youth, North Yorkshire Sport and Rural Arts) and include a range of sports and craft materials with a detailed booklet full of ideas for the school holidays.

**Please note that due to Department for Education criteria, the eligibility for Activity Packs is limited to statutory school-age children eligible for free school meals only. The eligibility framework for support through the Covid Winter Grant Scheme (i.e. supermarket vouchers) will retain the wider discretionary eligibility previously described.*

When we have received the packs in school, we will distribute them to the relevant families. We will also distribute the supermarket vouchers to eligible families before the Easter holidays.

If your financial circumstances have changed and you feel that your child may now be eligible for free school meals – **and ensure that school gains valuable funding too** – please do get in touch for a confidential discussion.

DfE information: Asymptomatic testing information for parents and adults in households with children at school or college

Undertaking regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing helps reduce transmission of the virus. Parents and other adults in households with children at school or college, who do not have symptoms, can now access regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. This includes childcare and support bubbles.

Tests are fast, easy and completely free. There are [different ways](#) for a household, childcare or support bubble to collect their test to take at home, twice-weekly:

- through your employer, if they offer testing to employees
- by collecting a home test kit from a local test site – anyone aged 18 or over can collect 2 packs of 7 tests
- by ordering a home test kit online – please do not order online if you can access testing through other routes, this frees up home delivery for those who need it most.

If you have any queries about the tests, and you live in England, please call 119 (free from mobiles and landlines). Lines are open every day from 7am to 11pm.

Children of primary school age (and below) without symptoms are not being asked to take a test. Testing is voluntary, but strongly recommended to all who are eligible. Alongside the vaccine, washing hands, wearing face coverings, and maintaining social distancing, rapid testing plays a vital role in reducing transmission rates. Getting into the habit of regular testing as part of our everyday lives will help us all to play our part and do what we can to protect each other.”

Further details about the different options for testing are listed here:

Get a test through your employer

Your workplace may offer rapid lateral flow testing to you. Contact your employer to find out more.

Take a test at a rapid lateral flow test site

You can take a rapid lateral flow test at a local site. Testing at these sites is assisted, which means you will swab yourself under the supervision of a trained operator.

You may need to book an appointment.

Collect test kits


You can collect 2 packs of home test kits at a local collection point. Each pack contains 7 tests.

Anyone 18 or over can collect.

Most collection points are open from 1.30pm to 7pm. You can check online if the location is open or busy before you go. You do not need to make an appointment.

Do not visit a collection point outside opening hours, as it may be used to test people with coronavirus symptoms outside these times.
