Please be aware of the following information to help ensure that these meetings run as smoothly as possible:

- You will see the remaining time for the appointment counting down in a blue bar at the top of the screen. This will turn red when the last 10 seconds begin.
- If anyone loses access to the system for some reason during the call, they can log in again and click *Start Appointment* on the video call screen. As long as the other person is still in the call this will let you continue with the appointment.
- When the countdown in the blue bar stops, the appointment time is over and the call will automatically end.
- **Note** that if you or the teacher are late, or leave and rejoin the call, it does **not** reset the timer. The appointment will always end at the scheduled time.
- **Note** that if you delay starting a call it does **not** extend the duration for that appointment. The appointment will always end at the scheduled times.

### Contact tracing – Easter Holidays

As in previous holidays, parents will be required to report a positive Covid-19 test result during the first part of the Easter break. This can be done by emailing our dedicated email address [covidalert@crayke.n-yorks.sch.uk](mailto:covidalert@crayke.n-yorks.sch.uk) This will be monitored between 9am and 10am each day during the holiday **from Saturday 27 March up to and including Thursday 1 April**. We do not need to be immediately notified of any positive results received after 1 April, up until our return to school. Please note that the school telephone line will NOT be available during the school holidays so email is the only method of contact to be used. In the event of us being notified of a positive case, we will contact relevant parents and carers via email to inform you of the implications.

## DfE information: Asymptomatic testing information for parents and adults in households with children at school or college

Undertaking regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing helps reduce transmission of the virus. Parents and other adults in households with children at school or college, who do not have symptoms, can now access regular, rapid coronavirus (COVID-19) testing. This includes childcare and support bubbles.

Tests are fast, easy and completely free. There are [different ways](#) for a household, childcare or support bubble to collect their test to take at home, twice-weekly:

- through your employer, if they offer testing to employees
- by collecting a home test kit from a local test site – anyone aged 18 or over can collect 2 packs of 7 tests
- by ordering a home test kit online – please do not order online if you can access testing through other routes, this frees up home delivery for those who need it most.

If you have any queries about the tests, and you live in England, please call 119 (free from mobiles and landlines). Lines are open every day from 7am to 11pm.

Children of primary school age (and below) without symptoms are not being asked to take a test. Testing is voluntary, but strongly recommended to all who are eligible. Alongside the vaccine, washing hands, wearing face coverings, and maintaining social distancing, rapid testing plays a vital role in reducing transmission rates. Getting into the habit of regular testing as part of our everyday lives will help us all to play our part and do what we can to protect each other.”

### Get a test through your employer

Your workplace may offer rapid lateral flow testing to you. Contact your employer to find out more.

### Take a test at a rapid lateral flow test site

You can take a rapid lateral flow test at a local site. Testing at these sites is assisted, which means you will swab yourself under the supervision of a trained operator.

You may need to book an appointment.

### Collect test kits


You can collect 2 packs of home test kits at a local collection point. Each pack contains 7 tests.

Anyone 18 or over can collect.

Most collection points are open from 1.30pm to 7pm. You can check online if the location is open or busy before you go. You do not need to make an appointment.

Do not visit a collection point outside opening hours, as it may be used to test people with coronavirus symptoms outside these times.
