

Road Safety Tips

As part of our PSHE curriculum, children learn the importance of Road Safety Awareness. We would particularly like to emphasise how important it is to ensure children have a safe place to cross when coming to/ from school and ask that parents use the Sports Hall and keep all junctions and pathways clear, particularly opposite the crossing into the lay-by so that there is somewhere for children to safely cross, re-enforcing what they are learning in school.

Look out for further updates to follow, on our progress regarding improving Road Safety around the school.



Step 1

Find a safe place to cross

If you cannot find an underpass, bridge, or a crossing, choose a place you can see clearly in every direction and where drivers can see you.

Avoid crossing in between cars or on a bend and make sure you can reach the pavement on the other side.



Step 2

Stop, look, and listen

Do not get too close to the traffic.

Step back from the edge of the road.

Look all around, listen carefully, and continue to look in all directions.



Step 3

Wait for traffic to pass

If there is traffic, wait for it to pass before you cross.

Once the traffic has passed, stop, look, and listen again.

Make sure you look in all directions.



Step 4

When it is safe, go straight across the road

Do not run.

As you cross, keep looking and listening for traffic.

Look out for cyclists and motorcyclists that may be crossing in between traffic.
