Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to the penultimate newsletter of this academic year! It has been a lovely week in school this week, with the highlight being Wednesday morning when children and staff had a taster session in their new classes ready for September. ### Extreme Heat – General Information for All

The current forecast remains extremely high for Monday and Tuesday of next week. It is absolutely essential that your child has a water bottle and sunhat in school with them. We will be encouraging the children to drink plenty and to refill their bottles during the day. It is also absolutely essential that your child has sun-cream applied before school and brings some with them to reapply during the day. We want the children to be as comfortable as possible so if they would like to wear their PE kits, they are welcome to do so even if not their usual PE day.

## Governor News

On Monday evening we met to bid farewell to a long-standing governor, Norman Jackson. I echo our Chair of Governors, Mr Porter's, comments that 45 years of service is a truly remarkable achievement. We hope that Norman won't be a stranger – in fact, we have already asked him to come back to school in the Autumn Term to officially open the running track! The annual Governor statement was shared via web post yesterday, outlining the work of the Governing Body over the past year. We are fortunate to have an absolutely exceptional group of highly committed and experienced governors who bring so much to the role and to the life of our school as a whole. Over the past twelve months, governors have met both virtually and in person. In addition, they have visited classes, inspected the premises, reviewed many policies, spoken to children, staff and representatives from the Local Authority, accompanied on educational visits, attended school events and much, much more. They are also a huge source of support to me in my role as Headteacher. In addition, over the past year Mr Porter has relentlessly pursued two projects to enhance our school – the perimeter fencing and the running track. Being a governor is not a paid role – these volunteers dedicate a huge amount of their own time to supporting the Crayke school community and I am immensely grateful for all that they do.
