

Mechanics & Construction – Design & Make a Moving Safari Vehicle – Including exploring existing products and designs, designing a product with a clear purpose and user, creating a product with wheels and constructing using glue, strengthening the product and evaluating once finished. Create, design, make, evaluate, wheels, axle, body, cab, dowel, gear & chassis.

Art

Printing – Animal Print on our Safari Buggies – Using repeated/overlapping shapes, mimicking prints from the environment (animals), using objects to press, roll and stamp to make prints. Repeating, pattern, overlapping, mimic, environment, objects, press, roll, rub & stamp.

Collage - Henri Matisse – The Snail – Taking inspiration from Henri Matisse to create an animal collage by using a combination of materials that are cut, torn or glued and then sorting, mixing and arranging them to create texture.

Cut, tear, glue, material, sort, arrange, mix, texture, abstract, work, idea, starting point, respond, methods & materials.

Science

Life process, living, dead, never living, food chain, food source, habitat, micro-habitat, depend & survive. Seasonal Changes – Observe changes between spring and summer. Change, similarity, difference, temperature warm, hot and weather.</u>

Computing (Using Purple Mash)

<u>Coding</u> – Including understanding what instructions and events are, using a code to make a computer program, understanding how code executes when a program is run, understanding what an algorithm is, creating and planning a computer programme using a design and algorithm, understanding and debugging simple programs.

Action, algorithm, background, bug, button, , click events, collision detection, command, debug, effect, event, execute, implement, input, instructions, interaction, interval, object, output, properties, run, scale, scene & sound.
