

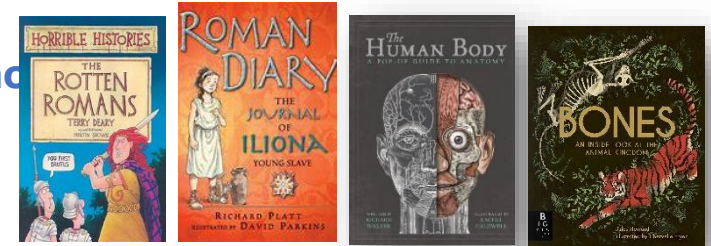

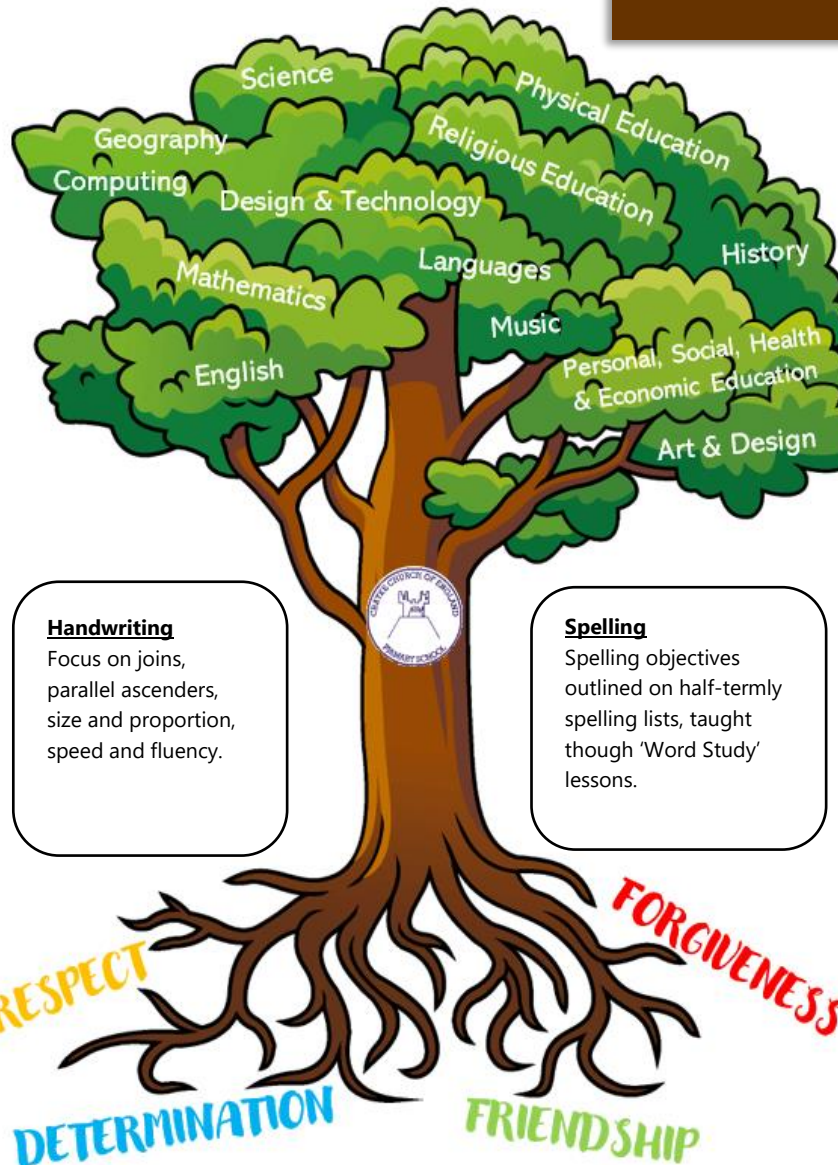
Isosceles, equilateral, scalene, trapezium, rhombus, parallelogram, kite, geometric shapes, quadrilaterals

Reading

Writing

Punctuation and Grammar

Noun, prefixes, pronouns, verbs, present perfect, adjectives, connectives/conjunctions (when, so, before, after, while, because) adverbs, noun phrases expanded by the addition of modifying adjectives, prepositional phrases, standard English forms for verbs, adverbial phrase, fronted adverbial, comma after fronted adverbials, possessive apostrophes for plural nouns, inverted commas, apostrophe to mark singular and plural possession, commas after fronted adverbials, inverted commas to indicate direct speech.

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Science

What is a healthy diet and why is it important?

Understand animals and humans

Identify that animals, including humans, need the right types and amounts of nutrition, that they cannot make their own food and they get nutrition from what they eat.
