
Handwriting Update



Carlton Lodge Year 5 Residential – Final reminders

Monday 5 June – Wednesday 7 June

We know that the children are really looking forward to the visit after half term. Some final reminders as follows:

- Children need to arrive at school at normal time on Monday morning with their luggage.


