Summer Fair – Final Total and Report

We are over the moon to announce that the profit from the summer fair has come in at a **whopping £2744!** This is a record-breaking amount – beating last year's total by just over £100, but beating the 2019 profit by a staggering £1000! Thanks once again for all the donations, support and sheer hard work which has gone into making this event so successful.

Roving Reporter Emma (Year 6) has produced this fabulous article to give a behind the scenes version of the day!

At 9:00 AM on Saturday the 24th June 2023, at Crayke Church of England Primary School, the CHASA volunteers were busy setting up the summer fair. Along with some parents that would be running stalls, and their children, the fair was ready so quickly that all of the children were able to play games with their friends, mostly playing football.

At midday, visitors started arriving. Adults, ex-pupils now in secondary school and some year six children were running the stalls. "I actually really liked running my stall," exclaimed Ethan Jackson, who helped run the jam jar raffle. "I liked seeing people excited about what they got." "My favourite stall is the jam jar raffle." Rosie Seligman told us. This stall was one of the most popular ones, because every ticket had been purchased before the fair was over. Maisy Emsley described running her stall "Hard and stressful."

There were many events during the four hours that the fair lasted for. From the start of the fair, a fire engine was outside, in the staff car park for one hour and a quarter. At 12:30 PM, the children's races lasting for an hour were on for half an hour on the running track, and skip 2 B fit started on the running track as soon as the fire engine left. The children's tug of war started at 2:00 PM, as soon as skip 2 B fit finished, and lasted for half an hour. The raffle was drawn at 3:30 PM. The fair ended at 4:00 PM, but many helpers stayed back late to clear up afterwards.

This year's summer fair has been the best one yet, thanks to all the amazing CHASA volunteers.





Dear Parents,

I am pleased to inform you that following the outstanding success of previous courses and the weekly coaching sessions, we are organising the 2023 summer football fun week.

The children will be coached by CRB POLICE CHECKED and F.A. QUALIFIED COACHES INCLUDING EX-PROFESSIONAL FOOTBALLERS who are used to working with and bringing the best out in children. The coaches will develop self-confidence and self esteem through encouragement and positive reinforcements. FOOTBALL IS NOT JUST FOR THE STAR PLAYERS!

The course is tightly structured with the players fully supervised at all times. All children are catered for from the absolute beginner to the more experienced players. Players are grouped together according to age, ability and experience. We have fantastic facilities including the outdoor 3-G pitch.
