### News from school this week – STEM Day

Our STEM Day was a great success! Our day began with a lovely surprise - Alice and her family brought one of their ewes with her 2-week-old lambs to show how the animals change and grow over time. Then everyone worked in their house teams and completed 4 different activities, moving around all the different classrooms in school. Mrs Rayner led a science investigation into how long it takes jelly to set using a range of different fruits and Mrs Helfferich's activity involved timing yourself at different HIIT style workouts and understanding the impact exercise has on your body. Mrs Chandler's activity focused on making a water clock and observing how to use a force (gravity) to help us tell the time. My own activity looked at how moths change over time to adapt to their environment. The children loved hiding their moths and the predator really struggled to find them around the field!

The children were wonderfully behaved, showing our school values in everything they did and all staff enjoyed working with all the children across school.

I'd like to say a HUGE thank you to my lovely colleagues who planned and delivered a fabulous range of activities and to the children who were enthusiastic and engaged throughout! A special mention to Alice and the Unsworths and the animals for a fantastic start to the day!

Miss Walker	Miss Walker shows forgiveness.


# News from school this week — Easter Crafts Session


