

Year 1 & for some year 2 children daily phonics delivered exclusively through 'Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Revised'.

Year 1 & 2 - Reading practice x 3 weekly sessions from 'Little Wandle Letters and Sounds revised. Drawing on what they already know or on background information and vocabulary provided by the teacher

#### <u>Writing</u>

Narrative – Based on 'The Enormous Turnip Once upon a time, Beginning, Middle, Climax, End, Character, Plot, Setting, Adjective, Noun, Singular, Plural, Suffix, Purpose, Possession & Apostrophe.

Non-Chronological Report – Based on the DK book plants (JC Unit used to support) Non-fiction, Fact, Introduction, Sub-heading, Illustration, Diagram, Prefix, Suffix, Prefix, Captions, Structure, Layout Audience, Simile,

Alliteration, Noun, Verb, Adjective & Adverb.

### **Design & Technology**

<u>Textiles – Pouches -</u> Including sewing a running stitch, joining fabrics using a running stitch and decorating using fabric glue and stitching. Accurate, fabric, knot, pouch, running stitch, sew, shape, stencil, template & thimble.

#### Art

Collage – Andy Goldsworthy - Art using natural materials—Using a combination of materials which are cut, turn and glued, sorting arranging and mixing materials and using some natural materials for printing. Collage, Cut, Tear, Glue, Sort, Arrange, natural & print.

<u>Drawing – Observational Drawings of Plants –</u> Including lines of different length and thickness, creating texture using dots and lines and colouring our own work. Line, size, thickness, colour neatly, pattern, texture, dots, line and tones.

#### Science

<u>Plant – How many different types of plant are there? – including identifying and</u> naming a range of common, wild and garden plants including everygree nand deciduous trees and describing the basic structures of plants and trees. Wild, garden, weed, deciduous, evergreen, roots, stem, leaves, flowers, petal, fruit, seed and bulb.

<u>Seasonal Changes – What is it like in summer? – Observe changes between spring</u> and summer. Change, similarity, difference, temperature warm, hot and weather.

### **Computing** (Using Purple Mash)

<u>Spreadsheets-</u> making a counting machine using 2Calculate. Copy, paste, count, data, column, total, cell.

<u>Pictograms-</u> understand data can be represented in picture form & contribute to a class pictogram. Title, data, collect, compare, pictogram, results.

<u>Presenting Ideas-</u> exploring presenting ideas through quizzes, fact files and presentations. <u>Presentation</u>, fact-file, quiz non-fiction fiction

Looking at historical events in Crayke and using phrases such as long ago, recently and phrases to show passing of time. Change, Similarity, Difference, Long ago, Recently, Date, Past, Present, Chronological Order & Crayke.
