### Upcoming Events – New Starter Survey


We are excited to meet our new Reception starters and their parents and carers in a series of events planned for later this term.



School Rule	How to break it
I. Have neat hair	You could gel up your hair in a funky way, wear a big hair accessory or spray your hair a different colour
2. No temporary tattoos	You can wear a temporary tattoo
3. No nail varnish	Paint your fingernails in a brightly coloured polish
