#### News from School this week

#### **Dinner Money Cost Increase from September 2024**

We have been informed by our Catering supplier - NYES Catering - that regrettably, our school meal cost will increase from £3.47 to £3.64 per day from September 2024. The meal cost to parents is currently £3.30 and school subsidise the remaining cost. As you can appreciate, with the current economic climate and the increased living wage cost from April this year, this increase has been unavoidable.

This was discussed at the last Governor's finance meeting and it was agreed that the school budget would continue to subsidise the cost of school meals from 1 September. Therefore, the cost of a school meal to parents/carers will be £3.50 for children in KS2 (Years 3-6) from the start of the new academic year.


