
## News from School – Safeguarding: Parking




## **PAT Dog Ginny**




#### **Class News- APPLE**

# The Year of the Outdoors What are you doing outside of school?


This week we have had some great ideas from Joe in year 1 but may need a little planning if you'd like to try this as his outdoor ideas came all the way from Greece on his trip at Easter!

Joe visited the Petralona Cave, (formed around a million years ago) at the foot of Mount Katsika in Greece.

Joe saw Stalactite and Stalagmite formations and the 'Petralona skull' estimated to be around 200,000 years old, the common ancestor of Neanderthal Man and the earliest evidence for human presence in Greece, along with the fossilised bones and teeth of hyenas, bears, rhinos and leopards.






