### How did Queen Elizabeth II show respect?

She continues to be remembered as a leader who showed great humility and care for others.

Throughout her reign, she championed unity and resilience, particularly during World War II and the COVID-19 pandemic, using her platform to inspire hope and continuity for her people.

As defender of the faith, Queen Elizabeth was a committed Anglican.


# Mahatma Gandhi

# How did Mahatma Gandhi show friendship?

As a young teenager in India, Gandhi led a rebellious life and went against his parents' values. But as a young man, he started to form beliefs of his own that harked back to the Hindu principles of his childhood. Gandhi began to dream of unity for all peoples and religions. Inspired by this idea, he led peaceful protests to free India from British rule and unite the country—ending violence and unfair treatment. His bravery and freethinking made him one of the most iconic people of peace in the world, known as 'Mahatma' meaning 'great soul'.

### How did he demonstrate courageous advocacy?

Mahatma Gandhi exemplified courageous advocacy by leading the non-violent resistance movement against British colonial rule in India. His philosophy of Satyagraha, or truth-force, encouraged peaceful protests and civil disobedience, inspiring millions to stand up for their rights and seek justice without resorting to violence.

Gandhi was a committed Hindu and believed in the principle of 'no harm to others'. He also had many friends of different faiths and enjoyed learning about their beliefs.

# Martin Luther King Jr.

### How did Martin Luther King Jr. show determination?

Martin Luther King Jr. grew up in a family of preachers and thought that was where his future lay. One day, a friend invited him to play at his house. Martin was shocked when his mother wouldn't let him in because he was black. That day he realised there was something terribly unfair going on. Martin believed that no one should remain silent and accept something if it's wrong. And he promised himself that—when he grew up—he'd fight injustice with the most powerful weapon of all: words. His determination to achieve equality for all continues to leave a legacy now.

### How did he demonstrate courageous advocacy?

Martin Luther King Jr. demonstrated courageous advocacy through his leadership in the American civil rights movement. He organised peaceful protests, delivered powerful speeches, and faced violent opposition, all while advocating for racial equality and justice. His commitment to non-violence and love as tools for change left a lasting impact on society.



# How did spirituality guide him?

Martin was a deeply spiritual man. Much, if not most, of his ideas on equality came from his religious beliefs. Christianity, was "a spirit of brotherhood made manifest in social ethics." This means that we are all equal and we all deserve equally.

# Corrie ten Boom

#### How did Corrie ten Boom show forgiveness?

In 1940, the Germans invaded the Netherlands, and Corrie ten Boom and her family helped to hide as many Jewish people as possible. Corrie and her family saved hundreds of Jewish people. Unfortunately, Corrie and her sister were caught by the German army and sent to a concentration camp. After the war, Corrie talked about her experiences and the importance of forgiveness. Later, Corrie went back to Germany. She met two Germans who worked at the camp, one of whom had been especially cruel to her sister. Corrie, amazingly, forgave them.

### How did she demonstrate courageous advocacy?

Corrie Ten Boom showed courageous advocacy by risking her life to hide Jewish refugees during the Holocaust. Her unwavering faith and moral conviction led her to defy the Nazi regime, ultimately resulting in her imprisonment. After the war, she dedicated her life to promoting forgiveness and reconciliation.



### How did spirituality guide her?

Corrie's trust in God gave her the strength to go on until the war ended. She said, "there's no pit so deep that God's love is not deeper still."
