News from School - OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning)

Dear Parents and Carers,

We are having a loose parts drive to support the Outdoor Play and Learning (OPAL) Primary Programme at our school! Through the programme, we are working to improve outdoor play at Crayke by offering more opportunities for creative, childled play and learning. Loose parts are open-ended materials that our children can use during outdoor play times. This focus collection drive will be focussed on: Wooden bowls, wooden utensils, metal utensils, metal pots and pans, whisks, cake/jelly moulds, ice cube trays, plastic bowls/utensils, funnels, measuring cups or scales. These will be used in the mud kitchen or on the music wall.






News from School – Statutory Assessments

By Jill Tomlinson




