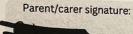
Reading

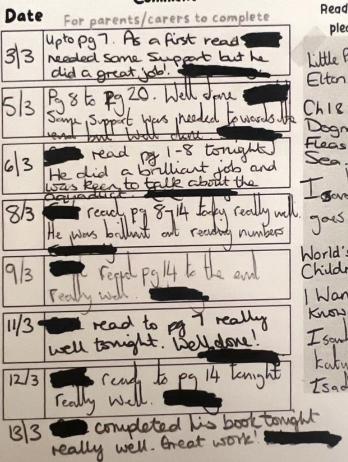

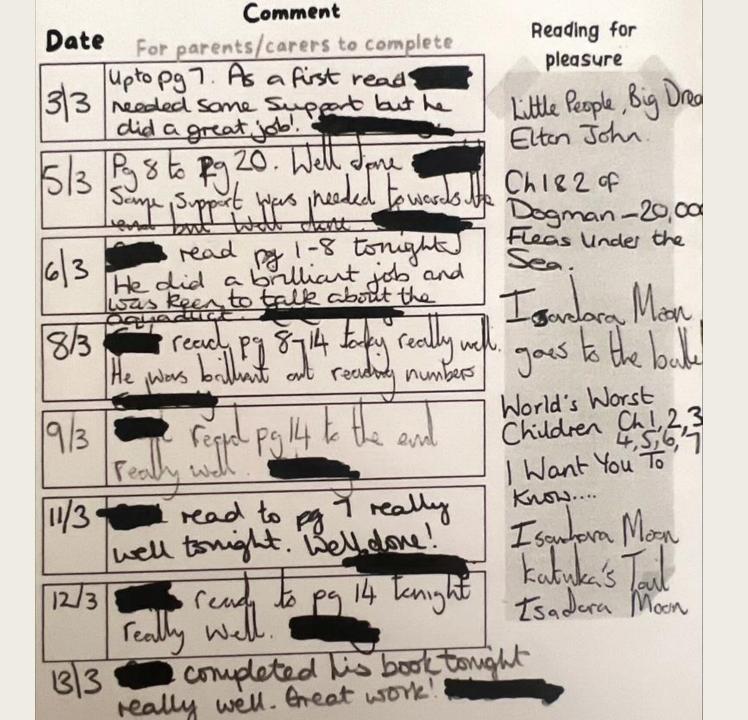
