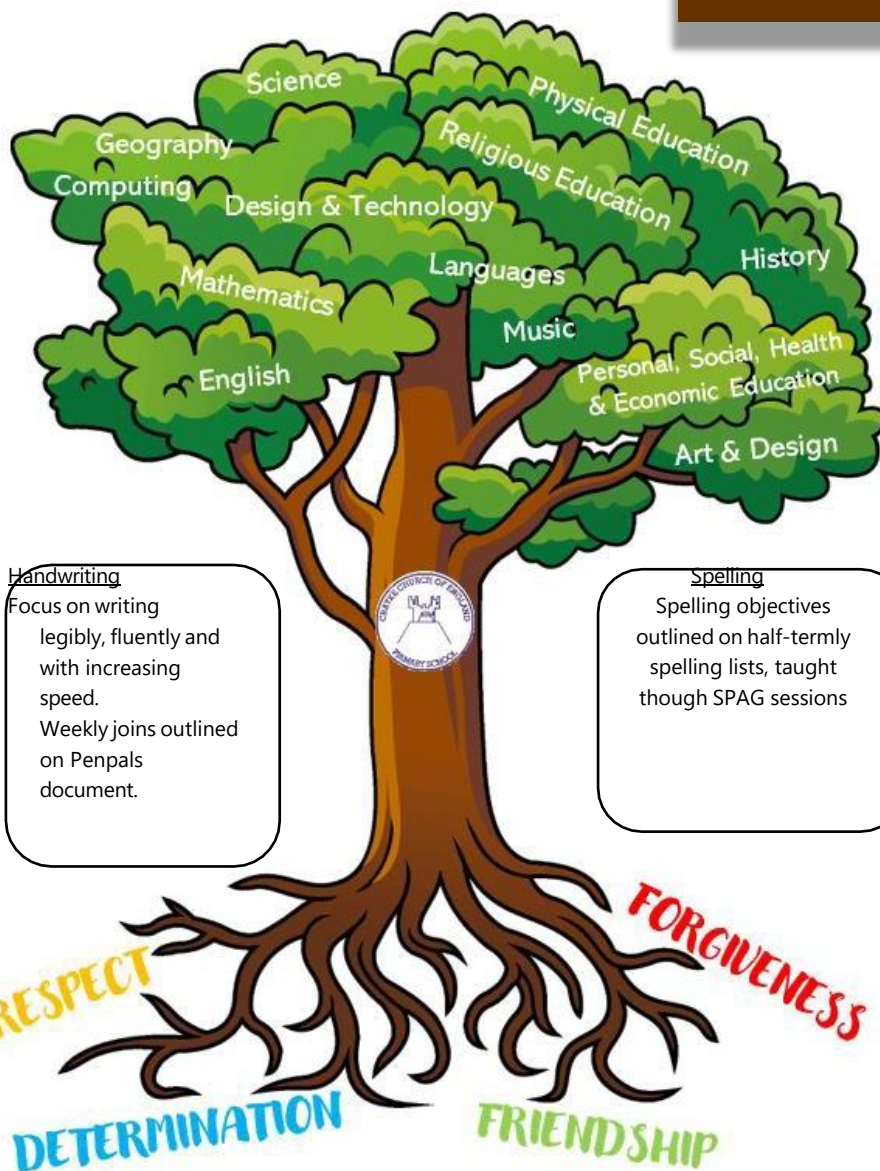

They will undertake fieldwork in the local environment. Children will create and present their results and describe the enquiry process that they have undertaken.
